

## SENSITIVE ISSUES CONSENT FORM

At Girl Scouts, we believe in working in partnership with girls and their families. Part of that is making sure that families feel informed about what their girl is participating in and empowered to choose whether their girl participates. Sometimes girls are interested in learning about subjects that might be more sensitive or controversial in nature. When possible, it's a good idea to communicate with parents/caregivers so that they know that these conversations are going to happen. This document is intended to be a guide to help you navigate these sometimes sensitive situations. Girl Scouts of the USA is a nonpartisan, nonpolitical organization- our role is to equip girls with the self-confidence and decision-making skills that will help them make informed and responsible choices in all areas of their lives.
