

GIRL/ADULT PACKING LIST

This is not a shopping list! Borrow when you can. If you cannot carry all your own gear, you may have packed too much. Parents – have your scout do her own packing so she knows where to find her items when she gets to camp. It's OK to include a small sleep object. Many items such as personal care items or wet/dirty clothes can be packed in plastic bags. It is a good idea to pack the sleeping equipment in a heavy duty trash bag or other weatherproof bag in case of rain.

Pillow	Mess Kit or plastic plate, bowl and cup
Ground Cloth/tarp, if sleeping outside	Utensils (knife, fork, spoon) can be plastic
Mosquito netting (Optional)	Dunk Bag/ Mesh Bag
