STEM Center Capital Campaign Update

We have raised \$4,858,880 from 160 gifts for the campaign.

Overall, we achieved 69% of our \$7 million campaign goal.

We are within \$341,000 of hitting the \$5.2 million benchmark we need to reach in order to break ground on the building.

The Daley Family Foundation has committed a \$1.5 million total gift for the STEM Center. They have issued a special challenge match for any new or increased gifts or pledges made to the campaign.

We have submitted a \$1.5 million request for a federal earmark.

We also have an additional **\$1.9 million** in requests in process.



2022 Cookie Program


The 2022 Cookie Program ended **21.75% higher** than 2021, with an increase in girls participating.


Total packages sold was 99% of 2019 pre-covid sales and 65% girl participation vs 2019
