

Important Information for Girl Programs

Who can attend?

- Any currently registered member of Girl Scouts may participate in council-sponsored programs and events specific to their current age level.
- Girls may participate individually or as part of a troop. Adult chaperones are required unless otherwise noted.
- Family and friends are welcome to attend "Family-Friendly" programs and events.

Get registered!

- GSNEO uses an online registration system. First time visitors must become a registered user by creating a profile and password.
- Payment is due at the time of registration using credit or debit cards, or GSNEO Pathway Passes.
- Registrations that can be accommodated after the close date will incur a \$5 late fee per person.
- Programs are filled on a first-registered, first-served basis. The online system indicates program capacity and remaining spaces available, as well as a waitlist.
- Waitlist openings are dependent on cancellations and are not a guarantee of being placed in a program.

Need financial assistance?

• Families that have a financial need may apply once per year for Scoutship assistance. Girls must be currently registered members to qualify. For more information and the application, visit gsneo.org > Contact Us.

Refunds & cancellations

- A full refund of the program fee will be given ONLY if the program is canceled by GSNEO.
- A partial refund may be granted for medical or family emergencies. Submit written requests for refunds no later than two weeks after the program date to registration@gsneo.org.

Want to start a babysitting business? Become First Aid/CPR/AED certified, learn childcare techniques, and understand how to start your own business! Practice caring for babies using an infant simulator. Fee includes American Red Cross blended learning First Aid/CPR/AED certifications, meals and snacks, and a babysitting starter kit. Complete some of the requirements for the Cadette Babysitting and First Aid badges (badges must be purchased separately).

This is a two-day, overnight program. All meals and snacks are provided. Adult fee includes cost of meals and snacks. Adult chaperones assist with basic classroom management, overnight management, and meal preparation.

Note: When registering a Girl Scout for this course, please use your Girl Scout's own, unique email address. This is important as the American Red Cross system recognizes all email addresses that have been used in their system. If your Girl Scout does not have an email account. they must create one. Your Girl Scout will be emailed, reminded, and informed by the American Red Cross through this email address and will be responsible for their own class. One week before class. participants will be emailed a link to complete the online portion of the American Red Cross blended learning First Aid/CPR/AED certification. Enter the correct email address when registering for this class. Prepare for the inperson skills test by completing

the online portion of simulated learning—the virtual course must be completed prior to attending the in-person session. After completion, a certificate will be issued to proceed to the in-person skills test. Bring a printed or digital copy of this certificate of completion to the class. Participants cannot attend the class without this proof of completion. Participants must be 13+ years old and physically have the upper body strength and stamina to correctly complete the repetitive and consecutive chest compression cycles required in CPR.

Give back to the environment with the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) as they provide opportunities to contribute to the Girl Scout Tree Promise and unlock the Girl Scout Tree Promise Patch! During this event, Girl Scouts will receive an introduction from state foresters on the importance of tree planting to the environment and biodiversity and watch a demonstration on how to plant before taking planting into their own hands! Participants will be split into age groups. Families may participate in the same group as their Girl Scout. Each group will receive an age-appropriate introduction to the importance of tree planting to the environment and biodiversity before a demonstration on how to plant. ODNR will provide water, light snacks, information, and swag for participants. IMPORTANT: Wear close-toed shoes and clothes that you are prepared to get muddy. 




