QUESTIONS REGARDING THE POSITION OF MEMBERSHIP DELEGATE

What is a Membership Delegate?

Membership Delegates are the "Voice of the Members" to the GSNEO Board of Directors and, leadership staff. Delegates are the channel of two-way communication on governance matters, bring the concerns of the membership to the attention of the Board of Directors and leadership staff. Their role is very similar to that of elected representatives in state & federal government.

Membership Delegate were instrumental contributors in the recent revision to the GSNEO Code of Regulations (bylaws), Operational Volunteer policies, Volunteer Finance policies, Vision 2012 property review and the work of the Process Improvement Teams.

Membership Delegates have voting rights in the GSNEO General Assembly body and vote in the election of the Board of Directors, Board Development Committee and National Delegates as well as all amendments to the Code of Regulations and other matters requiring a vote.

What skills are needed?

Successful Membership Delegates have:

- Strong communication skills including the ability to facilitate small group discussions.
- Organized and punctual.
- Ability to present information clearly, answer questions, and gather feedback without personal bias.
- Desire to work towards the betterment of the organization as a whole by facilitating open communication and discussion.

What are the responsibilities of a Membership Delegate?

The full responsibilities of the position are described in the 2011 Membership Delegate/Alternate Position Description is on page 12 in this packet or may be obtained from any GSNEO Service Center, or online at www.gsneo.org.

How much time does it take to fulfill this role?

Delegates should expect to dedicate approximately two to four hours per month to the fulfillment of their responsibilities. There is also a selection of meetings that delegates are required to attend every year. Some travel is required. Please see the 2011 Membership Delegate/Alternate Position Description, page 12, for more details.

How long is the term for this position?

The term is two years or until a successor is elected.

Is there an age requirement?

Yes, nominees must be 14 years of age or older at the time of the election.

If I am elected, will I receive training?

Yes, a Delegate self-study orientation will be sent in March.

How will I communicate with the Board of Directors and the membership?

Delegates facilitate two-way communication between the Board of Directors and the membership by using what is called the Circle of Communication. At the request of the Board and/or leadership staff, the staff liaison provides information to the delegates and answers any questions. The delegates then share that information with their assigned community leadership teams, service units and any other members with whom they interact. In addition to sharing the information, it is the responsibility of the delegate to solicit input from members, answer members' questions, and provide information as requested. The delegate then brings the input and reactions of her/his members back to the staff liaison, who compiles it and prepares a report for the Board and/or leadership staff who initiated the request.

QUESTIONS REGARDING THE NOMINATION PROCESS

Who is eligible to become a Membership Delegate?

Any current, registered member, 14 years of age or older, at the time of election, is eligible to run for election.

How can I nominate someone ?

Nominations are made using the Membership Delegate Nomination Form on pages 15-17 in this packet. Extra nomination forms are also available at any GSNEO Service Center or available by download at www.gsneo.org. Copies of the application are accepted

May I nominate myself? May I nominate more than one person?

Yes, you may nominate yourself, and you may submit as many nominations as you wish.

When can I submit nominations?

Nominations will be accepted Monday, December 13, 2010 through Monday, January 31, 2011 at 5:00 p.m.

How do I submit nominations?

How many positions are available?

Each county is entitled to a certain number of membership delegates based on the county's number of registered girl members as of September 30, 2010. The formula used for determining the number of delegates is located in the GSNEO Code of Regulations, Article X, Section 8.

Please refer to the 2010 Membership Delegate Election Schedule, on page 9 or the Membership Delegate Nomination Form, page 15, to find out how many delegate positions are available in your county. Additional copies are available at any GSNEO Service Center or may be downloaded from www.gsneo.org.

May a nominee run for election in more than one county?

No, all nominees must select one county in which they will run for election. However, the nominee does not have to select the county in which she/he resides; it may be any of the 18 counties. If a nominee runs for election in one county and is not elected, the nominee may not run again in another county until 2012.

QUESTIONS REGARDING THE ELECTION

When will the election occur?

The elections will take place at the Membership Meeting and Election scheduled in February 2011. Please see the 2011 Membership Delegate Election Schedule, on page 9, for a complete list. Members should attend the meeting designated for the county in which they reside, even if they are nominated for another county.

Who should attend the Membership Meeting & Election?

All registered members are invited to attend the Membership Meeting. Only registered members, 14 years of age and older, are eligible to participate in the election. Also, registered members are only eligible to participate in the election of delegates for the county they reside in. For example, if you live in Lorain County you are only eligible to vote in the election of delegates for Lorain County and therefore should attend the meeting designated for Lorain County. You are not eligible to participate in the election for any county other than the one you reside in.

If I am nominated, do I need to attend the election?

Nominees are strongly encouraged to attend the election, however, it is not a requirement of being elected.

How will the election be conducted?

The election will be conducted by the current Chief Delegate for that area, or her designee. Delegates will be elected by county and in a single ballot vote using the majority method. Under the majority method, each nominee receiving 51% or more of the votes will be elected, up to the number of open positions.

To illustrate - let's say ABC County is eligible to elect three Membership Delegates and one Alternate. There are 100 voting members from ABC County present at the meeting therefore, using a ballot, the votes were cast as follows:

Suzie Smith	75 votes - elected
Bill Bobs	68 votes - elected
Victor Vote	67 votes - elected
Mary Majority	55 votes - Alternate
Betty Ballot	49 votes
Robert Rules	37 votes

Each nominee must receive a majority of the votes in order to be elected. Since there are 100 voting members present, a majority is 51 votes. There are only three positions available so only the top three individuals who received 51 votes or higher will be elected. The next individual will become the Alternates. The Alternates will not be required to achieve a majority.

In the event there are not enough nominees to fill all Membership Delegate positions, vacancies will be left. According to the GSNEO Code of Regulations, vacancies will be filled by appointment by the Board of Directors.

Who is eligible to vote in the election?

In order to be eligible to participate in the vote, members must meet the following criteria:

- Be a current registered Girl Scouts of North East Ohio
- Be at least 14 years of age at the time of the election
- Reside within the county the delegates are being elected to represent. For example, you must reside in Lorain County in order to vote in the Lorain County election.

Every member who is eligible to participate in the vote will receive a voting card at the registration desk when they arrive at the meeting.

How will the alternates be chosen?

Please see "How will the election be conducted?"

What is a Chief Delegate?

Each service area is entitled to elect a Chief Delegate-one individual who serves as a coordinator of all delegates in that area. This individual presides over any membership meetings in the service area, conducts the election of Membership Delegates and helps in the coordination of delegate activities.

The Chief Delegate must be a Membership Delegate who is nominated and elected by the Membership Delegates from that service area. For example, the West Service Area consists of Lorain, Erie, Huron, Seneca and Sandusky Counties. The Membership Delegates from these counties will nominate and elect one person from their ranks to serve as the Chief Delegate for a period of two years. The nomination and election of the new Chief Delegates will take place at the SUD/Membership Delegate workshop for that service area.

How will vacant positions be filled?

Whether the vacancy is from the previous term or is a vacancy after the February 2011 Elections, according to the GSNEO Code of Regulations, vacancies will be filled by appointment by the Board of Directors.

The appointment process will begin after the Election sessions are completed. Members interested in applying for an appointment need to complete the GSNEO Delegate Acknowledgement and Nomination form and submit it to:

PURPOSE

The Membership Delegate/Alternate is elected by their girl and adult constituents to serve as their voting representative in matters related to the governance of Girl Scouts of North East Ohio. The delegate is entrusted with the responsibility of sharing information, as referred to her/him by the Board of Directors and staff, and then utilizing her/his communication skills and an open mind to gather feedback from her/his constituents. She/he must understand the issues and concerns of her/his constituencies as well as appreciate Council-wide issues in order to think globally for the good of the entire organization.

MISSION

The mission of Girl Scouts of North East Ohio is to build girls of courage, confidence, and character, who make the world a better place.

VISION

Girl Scouts of North East Ohio will be the organization of choice of girls and recognized by the community as the best model for leadership development for girls and women.

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Act as a channel for two-way communication between constituents and the Council.
 - Understand her/his constituencies' issues and concerns as well as appreciate Council-wide issues and needs in order to think globally for the good of the entire organization.
 - Understand corporate functions, including being able to review and understand any Council financial reports provided.
 - Attend regular meetings of the General Assembly of the Council, held biannually. Attend special meetings as called within the jurisdiction of the Code of Regulations. Attend Membership Meetings in designated area. Delegates will be given advance notice of all meetings.
 - Elect the Officers of the Board of Directors, the Directors-at-Large of the Board of Directors, the members of the Board Development Committee, and the Delegates and Alternate Delegates to the National Council of Girls Scouts of the United States of America, in accordance with the procedures outlined in the Code of Regulations.
 - Participate in votes to amend or revise the Articles of Incorporation and the Code of Regulations as presented at meetings of the General Assembly of the Council.
 - Submit proposals to the Board of Directors to improve the quality of Girl Scouting.
 - Promote the organizations programs, services and goals to the community-at-large.

LENGTH OF TERM

Serve two (2) years or until her/his successor is elected and assumes office. Membership delegates shall not serve more than 2 consecutive terms, but may run again provided that a minimum of one (1) year has expired since the end of the last term in office.

MEETINGS AND TIME COMMITMENT

- **Delegate Self-Study Orientation** – Two hours.
 - **Monthly Delegate Conference Calls** – One hour, on average, every month.
 - **Community Leadership Teams and Service Unit Assignments** – Represent Service Unit she/he is assigned. A Delegate is responsible for¹:
 - Maintain consistent communication with Service Unit Director either by phone or email.
 - Attend a majority of the monthly Community Leadership Team meetings.
 - Attend service unit meeting as requested by the Service Unit Director or Girl Scouts of North East Ohio Staff.

¹ Each Delegate/Alternate will be assigned to represent the members of Service Unit(s) within the county in which they were elected. On average, each Delegate is responsible for two (2) to four (4) Service Units. Based on the Service Units Assignments they will also be assigned to one Community Leadership Team.

MEETINGS AND TIME COMMITMENT, CONTINUED

- **Spring Meeting of the General Assembly** – One (1) per year.
- **Annual Meeting of the General Assembly** – One (1) per year.
- **Delegate/Service Unit Director Workshop** – One (1) per year.
- **Membership Meetings** – One (1) per year.

FINANCIAL EXPECTATIONS

- Maintain membership in the Girl Scouts of the U.S.A.
 - Annually - \$12
 - Lifetime - \$300 (encouraged)
- Travel and expenses at individual's expense.

NON FINANCIAL EXPECTATIONS

- Be committed to the Girl Scout mission & values
- Adherence to all policies and procedures of Girl Scouts of North East Ohio.
- Compliance with the GSNEO Code of Regulations.
- Be alert to GSNEO related concerns that can be addressed by GSNEO mission, objectives, and programs.
- Communicate and promote GSNEO mission and programs to the community when appropriate.

CODE OF CONDUCT

As part of my responsibilities as a Membership Delegate:

- I will adhere to the Council Code of Regulations and all policies of the Board of Directors.
- I will stay informed about what's going on in the council, ask questions, request information, and actively participate in and take responsibility for issues, policies, and other matters referred to Delegates/Alternate by the Board of Directors and/or staff.
- I will actively participate in delegate conference calls in order to keep up to date on governance activities. If I am unable to participate in a conference call, I accept responsibility for contacting the liaison to get the information.
- I will share information with my constituents in an accurate and timely manner.
- I will represent the viewpoints of both my girl and adult constituents with honesty, integrity, and an open mind. I will serve my constituents as a whole, rather than limit my representation to any special interest group(s).
- In accordance with my voting rights and responsibilities, I will attend the Spring Meeting and the Annual Meeting of the General Assembly as well as the Membership Meeting in my area. I will read all pertinent information prior to the meeting.
- I will act in the best interests of the organization by conducting myself professionally and acting in accordance with the Girl Scout Promise and Law.
- If I do not fulfill these commitments to my constituents and the organization, I will expect to be contacted by a Council representative to discuss my responsibilities with me.

In turn, the organization will be responsible to me to:

- Provide the tools and guidance necessary to fulfilling my responsibilities.
- I will be sent, without request, governance and related information necessary to the fulfillment of my responsibilities.
- Opportunities will be offered to me to discuss governance matters and the organization's goals, activities, and status; additionally, I can request such opportunities.
