100 Years of Girl Scouting

Juliette Gordon Low

Juliette Gordon Low, founder of Girl Scouts of the USA, was born on October 31, 1860, in Savannah, Georgia. Her large Savannah home, which was purchased and restored by Girl Scouts of the USA in 1953, is now known as the Juliette Gordon Low Girl Scout National Center, or often referred to as the Birthplace. The handsome English Regency house was designated a registered National Historic Landmark in 1965. Visitors travel from across the United States year-round to take part in programs and learn more about the organization's remarkable founder.

Juliette or Daisy, as she was affectionately called by family and friends, was the second of six children of William Washington Gordon and Eleanor Kinzie Gordon. Family members on her father's side were early settlers in Georgia, and her mother's family played an important role in the founding of Chicago, Illinois.

On March 12, 1912, Juliette Low gathered 18 girls to register the first troop of American Girl Guides. Margaret "Daisy Doots" Gordon, her niece and namesake, was the first registered member. The following year, the name of the organization was changed to Girl Scouts.

Juliette Low founded Girl Scouts with a vision of bringing girls of all background into the out-of-doors and giving them the opportunity to develop self-reliance and resourcefulness.

From the very beginning, she was driven by a far-reaching goal of expanding what was possible for girls — all girls. In fact, Juliette believed in Girl Scouting so much that she sold her treasured pearls to keep the organization going.

Low was diagnosed with breast cancer in 1923, but she kept it a secret as she continued her involvement with the Girl Scouts. She died on January 17, 1927, and was buried in her Girl Scout uniform. Today, as we approach the 100th anniversary of Girl Scouting, we celebrate that Juliette's original gathering of 18 girls has grown to 3.2 million Girl Scouts — 2.3 million girl members and 880,000 adult members working primarily as volunteers.

Through its membership in the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS), Girl Scouts of the USA is part of a worldwide family of 10 million girls and adults in 145 countries.

The Girl Scout Kit Program consists of:

1. The Scrapbook Studio will assemble kits for purchase especially designed for current or past leaders and members to create from their own photos and memorabilia. Participants will be responsible for bringing their own photos, journaling and memorabilia. It is expected the cost of each double-layout kit will be priced between \$10.00-\$15.00 which will include all papers, mats, adhesives, embellishments and stickers. Some photo and memorabilia reproduction will be available at The Studio for a small additional charge.
2. Special Class times will be scheduled for participants to come into The Scrapbook Studio to assemble their scrapbook layouts. Prior registration is required for these class times so adequate Studio staff will be available to assist participants.
3. At the end of the program, approximately February 29th, all completed projects will be assembled and placed in a full-sized scrapbook album ready for display at 100th Anniversary functions and events!

Introducing The Scrapbook Studio's Recycled Art Program:

Recycled Frame Class: Bring in an old picture frame and we'll show you how to recycle that frame and turn it into a beautiful work of paper and photo art! We will teach you how to punch, fold and ink paper flowers and show you different shading techniques along with placement of the photos and color matching!



Cardboard House & Album: Turn strips of cardboard boxes into a self-standing work of art! You can add photos, embellishments, anything you like to this wonderful project!



File Folder Album & Tags: Recycle an old file folder and turn it into a mini album full of tags holding your favorite photos, tickets, newspaper articles and more! Or give it as a gift!



Special classes are available for Girl Scout troops and members to participate in these recycled art classes. Please contact The Scrapbook Studio for more information and to schedule these events!



Butler Art Programs

- **Life-size Paper Uniforms (past and present):**

Scouts will depict the evolution of the Girl Scout uniform throughout the 100 years. Uniforms will be cut from large paper, painted and hung on wire hangers and clothesline for **display**.

Level recommendation: Junior, Cadette, Senior, Ambassador

- **Paper Doll Portraits:**

Scouts will design, paint, and cut out a paper doll of themselves wearing their uniform. All troop members paper dolls will be attached hand-in-hand to form a paper doll chain.

Level Recommendation: Daisy, Brownie

- **Clay Relief Tiles:**

Square (quilt-like) tiles will be made with air-dry clay depicting Girl Scout symbols, stories, and anything related to scouting. Tiles will be painted upon completion and can be arranged (glued) to a board as in a quilt style to represent each member of a particular troop.

Level Recommendation: All

- **Clay Storytellers:**

In the style of the Pueblo Indians of the Southwest, scouts will learn the techniques of hand-building with clay and create a modern version of a Native American storyteller. The storyteller could be a family member, scout leader, or fellow scout. As with traditional storytellers, other scout members, family members, pets, etc. will be sitting around and on the storyteller.

Level Recommendation: All

Cost: \$80.00/2 hour class – maximum 16 scouts

plus supplies between \$2.00- \$5.00/scout

Dear Art Educator,

The Eastwood Mall and the Art Outreach Gallery Board of Directors invite you and your students to exhibit artwork at the Art Outreach Gallery at the Eastwood Mall in Niles. The entire gallery will be transformed into school art shows from March 9 through May 20, 2012. The show will run March 9 through March 25, 2012.

Below is a gallery checklist for the shows:

- **LAYOUT:** You will need to plan to fill the required space. We will discuss individual school placement at the scheduled meeting with a lead teacher from each school and the gallery show committee. The meeting for this show is scheduled for TBA. Please call Gail at 330.218.7833 if you cannot attend the meeting.
- **DROP-OFF:** Works can be dropped off and hung **Wednesday, February 29 through Thursday, March 8**. All preparation of the space must be completed by **Friday, March 9**. Access to the gallery requires signing out of the key with Eastwood Mall Customer Service Center. You are also required to sign the key back in at the customer service center. The door lock is located at the bottom of the right door. Please lock the door in place. The doors will slam into the windows if the doors are not lock.
- **PICK-UP:** All artworks will be picked up on **Monday, March 26 and Tuesday March 27 during** mall hours.
- **INVENTORY:** The teacher will be responsible for the inventory - see attached ENTRY FORM/Inventory sheet. The inventory sheet is for your use.
- **LABELING:** The teachers will label all work. - We suggest that you use Avery label 5160 - 1"x 2.63", clear mailing label with the students name, grade, school name and teacher's name. You may add a price and contact phone number if the work is for sale.
- **HANGING:** Teachers are responsible for hanging all work. - For gallery protection and ease of hanging, all works are required to be hung from the back so there is no visible evidence of hanging hardware. Paper, matted and light pieces of work can be hung using Gorilla Glue and wire or string or push pins, whereas framed pieces will require standard hanging hardware.
- **3-D PIECES:** There is shelving available for three-dimensional works.
- Teachers are responsible for supervising pick up and drop off artwork.
- **VOLUNTEERING:** For the gallery to remain open it is essential that we have volunteers to gallery sit. Please encourage your students, Key Clubs, National Honor Societies, athletic teams, fellow teachers and parents to volunteer in the gallery; it is fun and an interesting way to share in this amazing community development program and unique art program. The gallery requires two volunteers at all times. When students under the age of 18 are volunteering and not a senior an adult over the age of 18 will be present.
- **SALES OF WORKS:** Frequently our patrons ask if the works are for sale. We invite your students to sell artwork, but do not handle the details of sale. In order to facilitate, we can provide contact information but will do nothing more. The Gallery will not provide direct contact information for any students without prior written consent and authorization. Also, the Gallery does not assume any liability for the sale of art and provides no warranty on sale - it is the responsibility of the parties. **Teachers wishing to act as a facilitator for sales of their students' works may provide their contact information** or the contact information of the parent.

- **CARE OF WORKS:** You will need to help us take necessary precautions to safeguard your students' works as well as the works of others at the Gallery. Understand that the Art Outreach Gallery and the Eastwood cannot assume liability for loss or damage and that artwork will be handled and exhibited at the artists' risk. Please help us make this a positive, enjoyable experience for everyone participating.
- **RECEPTIONS/PERFORMANCES:** You will have the opportunity to showcase your school district for one of the three weekends that you are participating in the show. The gallery will be available for your school's art opening reception and recognition. Students from each school district will also have an opportunity to perform during their school exhibition and opening reception. We ask the art teachers to communicate this with their music and drama teachers to line up the performances. Please provide Gail Stark with the names of the students performing when we meet for the meeting on TBA.
- **HANDOUTS:** Each school district will provide a handout/flyer with the participating students and teacher's names.
- **PRESS RELEASES:** The Art Outreach Gallery will send press release for the shows. .
- **MEETINGS:** The participating teachers and gallery committee will be meeting at the gallery on TBA to allocate gallery wall space and discuss show details.
- Please RSVP confirmation of participation through Gail Stark at 330.219.7833.

The Art Outreach Gallery is an art appreciation initiative and community development project. The gallery is an effort to reach new audiences through public art exhibitions. The location is next to Daffin's Candies, along the concourse between Macy's and Sear's. The hours of operation are Friday 5:00pm to 9:00pm, Saturday 1:00pm to 9:00pm, and Sunday 1:00pm to 5:00pm.
