

GSENO Spring Camporee (Canfield) Frequently Asked Questions - FAQ's

Who may attend?

- All registered members of Girl Scouting, their family and friends.
- All spending the night must be registered members of Girl Scouting
- All adult overnight guests (men and women) must be registered members of Girl Scouting
- Boys, ages 5-17, may attend with their families. Details about separate sleeping arrangements are listed below.
- Saturday is open to the public.
- Individuals/troops who do not pre-register will have an increase fee at the door of \$5.

Event Registration:

- Registration is now available online on the gsneo.org website. Deadline is April 9, 2012.

Timeframe of the Event:

- The Spring Camporee (Canfield Fairgrounds) will be held beginning Friday, April 27 (at 5:00 PM) to Sunday, April 29 (at 10 AM).
- Saturday, April 28th Day Only Passes may be purchased. Sign In/Registration begins at 7:00AM

Tent Camping:

- Each campsite is 32' x 40' and will fit 8 of the 8' x 8' tents.
- Suggestion for tent layout:
 - 4 – 8' x 8' tents along each side (depth 32'/8' tent width = 4 tents each side). With a row of tents on the left 8' wide + a 24' wide center for dining fly/canopy + a row of tents on the right side 8' wide = 40' across
- Each site has a fee of \$50. If a troop/group needs additional space additional sites may be purchased.
- All tents must be provided by the attendees.
- There is no per tent fee. Only full campsites can be reserved.
- If planning on bringing larger tents, please plan for the space accordingly. If more space is needed when you arrive at the fairgrounds, you will be relocated and an additional site fee will be assessed.
- Sleeping areas:
 - Troop/Group Camping: All troops/groups will stay together in a girl's only sleeping area. According to safety guidelines, if there is an adult male member of a troop, he may not be counted in overnight girl/adult ratios and will not be allowed to stay with the troop. Adult male members will be placed in a men/boys sleeping section. All boy siblings will also be in the men/boys section and must have proper adult supervision in that area.
 - Men and boys 5-17: A separate sleeping area will be designated for men and boys. All boys must have adult supervision in the sleeping area
 - Families: Individual families may choose to stay as a family unit in a designated camping area. The family unit will accommodate both males and females.

Meals and Meal Tickets:

- There are 2 options for meal tickets:
 - All weekend pass: Provides all meals from Friday Dinner to Sunday Breakfast (5 meals). Cost is \$25.00. Variety of menu options available.
 - Saturday only meal pass: Provides all meals beginning Saturday breakfast to Saturday dinner (3 meals). Cost is \$15. A variety of menu options available.
- Additional a la carte items and fair food will be available for purchase at the event.

- No campfires are permitted and no campfire cooking will be allowed.
- Camp propane stoves may be used in designated areas adjacent to the camping area. They will not be permitted in the camping area.
- Troops/groups/families may bring in their own food/snacks or choose to purchase meal tickets and a la carte items.

Program Activities:

- Many fun activities will be provided at no additional fee. These include an outdoor skills area, archery, bounce houses, crafts, swaps, service projects and hands-on activities.

Pathway Passes:

- Pathway Passes may be used for this event.

Additional money at event:

- Additional spending money may necessary for exhibitors and souvenirs that will be at the event. All program activities are included in the camporee fee.

Confirmation:

- Confirmation materials and a handbook will be emailed prior to the event. It will include information specific to the schedule, activities, events, meals, campsites, safety guidelines, etc...
