





The Year Began...

A sell-out crowd of 3,130 gathered for the **2020 Mall Lock-in** "Out of This World" event – with activities that connected with our Space Science badges. Troops created banners to show their "out of this world" style, learned about space exploration with several NASA displays, made pocket solar systems, calculated their age and weight on other planets, watched the movie Planet 51, and danced and played all night long!


Then Our World Changed

As COVID-19 began to impact communities worldwide, and our state went into a lockdown to slow the spread, our inperson program opportunities were sent into a tailspin. We had to quickly pivot to figure out what could be shifted to a virtual experience and what



could be postponed to a later date.

Our team jumped into action to create a plan to make sure girls remained connected to Girl Scouts while we navigated this global pandemic together. Three days after we canceled in person experiences, we launched our Girl Scouts At Home webpage and our first virtual Facebook Live nature hike experience! Our first event received over 3,000 views within the first day. We even hosted virtual camp open houses for Camps Ledgewood, Sugarbush and Timberlane on Facebook Live. Additionally, virtual Badge and Journey videos were posted three times a week with supply lists, to encourage our girls to join the fun.





PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS



Summer Camp

During the first week of March of 2020, GSNEO saw record breaking registrations for summer camp. New and experienced campers alike were excited to spend their summer at our camp properties, making new friends and experiencing all the fun that camp has to offer. By the second week of March, our country went into lockdown in an attempt to flatten the COVID-19 curve, leaving the fate of summer camp uncertain. By the end of April, GSNEO made the difficult decision to cancel in-person summer camp and to adapt as many of our programs as we could to a virtual platform. Within 6 weeks,



GSNEO camp staff devised plans and curriculum for a Facebook Live "Camp in Campout" summer camp kickoff event that included former GSUSA CEO Sylvia Acevedo as the keynote speaker, 25 virtual "Camp at Home" programs that would span 6 weeks through June – July, 5 differently themed "Family Activity Kits" so families could

experience a little summer camp fun together in their homes, and 14 "Badge in a Box" options for girls to earn outdoor and camp themed badges on their own.

Would "Camp at Home" be successful? Could camp possibly adapt to a virtual platform? These were some of the many questions we faced as we pivoted to make summer camp available to girls. As camp staff led virtual sessions with 200 GSNEO and out-of-state Girl Scouts who signed up for the programs, we quickly learned that camp is not just a place, but a feeling. Though we were all apart, looking at each other in the now so familiar Zoom Squares, campers and counselors were still able to discover, connect, learn, laugh, and grow together - all the things that make summer camp the magical experience that it is. GSNEO is proud to have provided girls with an opportunity to socialize with their peers and continue to make lasting camp memories. Thank you to all of our "Camp at Home" campers who participated in our arts and crafts, virtual hikes, kitchen STEM experiments, Zoom all-camp campfires, and everything in between. You made the summer of 2020 unforgettable!

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

Grant Funded Initiatives

In 2020, with funding support from Cuyahoga Metropolitan Housing Authority (CMHA), we engaged 196 girls in Girl Scouts by providing enrichment programming for girls in grades K-8 at several of their sites. Our troops met weekly to earn badges and learn about computer

programming,

the engineer

design process,



how to be of service to your community and more through our Girl Scout badge and Journey curriculum.

Several girls in CMHA troops return year after year, excited to continue their Girl Scout experience with their friends. This continued engagement has helped support some truly amazing girls. Dar'riel, for example, has been with Girl Scouts since she was little and has grown in her confidence over the years. In 2020, she was honored with the MyCom Youth Community Service Award for volunteering

in the Central neighborhood. She learned early on that using her voice and actions can

make the world a better place.

As our older Girl Scouts grow into leadership roles through our program, they become comfortable mentoring younger Girl Scouts. Every year, we offer fun experiences to recruit Daisies to start their Girl Scout experience and encourage our older girls to assist with activities and help mentor girls on their Girl Scout journey.

As March arrived and we began to deal with the effects of a global pandemic, Girl Scouts looked a little different. Our Grant Funded Initiatives team met this challenge head on and continued to offer experiences throughout the summer months by delivering themed activity bundles and supplies to complement virtual meetings and mailing self-directed Family Activity and Badge in a Box kits to keep girls engaged.


Badge in a Bundle

Badge in a Bundle gives girls an opportunity to complete badges while having all the necessary supplies at their fingertips. This fall, 11 Badge in a Bundle DIY kits were launched using the new

Trees, and Senior Sky.



Girl Scouts Rise to the Challenge of a COVID-19 World

Girl Scouts is continuing to serve girls in our community in this unprecedented time. With the dedication of our staff, volunteers, and girls we are keeping the Girl Scout fire burning. In April 2020 we launched the #GSNEOPositivityProject to share the efforts our girls are making throughout our council to make the world a better place. Whether it is donating cookies to our first responders and healthcare workers, virtual visits to nursing homes with recordings of songs and skits, or leaving uplifting messages for strangers to find, our girls are making a difference in their communities.

Our troops found creative ways to sell cookies and make a positive impact in their communities. Troop 50419 completed a virtual cookie booth, where family and friends sponsored boxes of cookies to be donated to local healthcare workers. Ohio Governor Mike DeWine spotlighted Troop 71268 during one of his press conferences in April. This Junior Girl Scout Troop sold cookies that were donated to the Ohio Turnpike plazas to provide a special treat for truck drivers delivering goods during the COVID-19 crisis. We are so proud of the resiliency, ingenuity, and determination of our Girl Scout members.

We also had some very generous donors who stepped up to purchase large amounts of cookies that positively impacted our Cookie Program. These generous donors were able to choose where their cookies were donated. Giant Eagle/GetGo provided cookies to teachers in the greater Cleveland area. The Mt. Sinai Foundation provided cookies to healthcare workers who were on the front lines of the pandemic in Northeast Ohio. Cardinal Health purchased cookies for their warehouse workers. An anonymous donor stepped forward to provide cookies at the Akron-Canton Regional Foodbank.

Girl Scouts at Home

The COVID-19 pandemic had GSNEO's staff scrambling for supplies we never thought we'd need—ring lights and headsets for Zoom meetings, industrial sanitation sprayers recommended by the CDC for camp equipment, and so much hand sanitizer!

During a typical year, GSNEO offers dozens of programs to members every month where girls can earn badges or learn a new skill. When we could no longer meet safely in person with our Girl Scout sisters, GSNEO created Girl Scout at Home to bridge the gap. This online resource contains videos, activity sheets, and everything a girl would need to earn specific Girl Scout badges at home. Our staff stepped up to create this content, filming on their phones and working through weekends to get videos uploaded for our members. Funders in the community stepped up as well, unrestricting grants and providing support for Girl Scouts at Home, including: the George Gund Foundation, the Florence Crittenton Services Fund of the Cleveland Foundation; and Akron Community Foundation.


Donor Spotlight

Virtual Programming at Horizon Education Centers

GSNEO has a commitment to making Girl Scouts accessible to every girl who wants to participate. We seek out grants annually to bring Girl Scouts to communities where families live below the poverty line. Our staff form troops at local schools and community centers, then meet with them over a series of weeks to complete activities and earn Girl Scout badges. When the COVID-19 pandemic shuttered schools and caused a slew of program cancellations, our staff had to find a new way to reach this population of girls who may not have reliable access to internet at home for virtual programming.

Thanks to grants from the Community Foundation of Lorain County, Nordson Corporation Foundation, and the Norton Family Foundation; we partnered with Horizon Education Centers this year to bring Girl Scouts to girls in Lorain and Elyria. While the Centers were open to students, state restrictions still barred outside vendors from being in the building, so we worked with the teachers to visit their classroom through the computer. For one hour every week, at 5 centers across the county, girls gathered in a room and worked on Girl Scout badges with Ms. Susan. They were able to interact with Ms. Susan through Zoom meeting software while Horizon employees helped with hands-on activities.

These Girl Scouts completed their "Think Like a Programmer" Journey, learning about how programmers use computational thinking to solve problems. The photos above are from the Binary Bracelet activity, where grade-schoolers learn about algorithms. With a sheet explaining Morse code for various letters in the alphabet, girls found the first letter of their first name. They then used colored beads to "spell out" the letter on a bracelet. This lesson helps girls understand programming: a series of commands will get you a result.
