

Dr. Ka-Pi Hoh is currently a Process Mining Business Process Leader at The Lubrizol Corporation.

Since joining Lubrizol in 1988, Dr. Hoh has held a variety of leadership positions including expatriate assignments in the United Kingdom and China. She spent four years on assignment in China as the head of research, development, and testing for Lubrizol Additives China and currently has an appointment as an Associate and Visiting Professor at the Zhuhai College of Jilin University.

Also involved in Lubrizol's diversity initiatives, Dr. Hoh is a member of Lubrizol's Corporate Inclusion Steering Committee, is a founding member of the Asia-Pacific Resource Group, and of Women in Lubrizol Leadership. Before her leadership role in process mining, she was Change Management Director overseeing the change aspects for the global SAP upgrade of Lubrizol's ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) system.

Dr. Hoh has a B.S. in Polymer Engineering and a minor in Economics and an M.S. and a Ph.D. in Macromolecular Science from Case Western Reserve University. As an alumna, she is currently on the Case Advisory Board and chairs the Industrial Advisory Board for the Department of Macromolecular Science. She also serves on the visiting committees for International Affairs and for the Office of Inclusion, Diversity, and Equal Opportunity. She is an emeriti board member for the Alumni Association and for the Flora Stone Mather Center for Women. She also serves as a professional mentor for WISER (Women in Science and Engineering Roundtable).

Dr. Hoh was recently re-appointed as chair of the Board of Directors for The Lakeland Foundation at Lakeland Community College. She is also board director for the Lake Humane Society, Apollo's Fire, and the Andy Nowacki Foundation.

Betsy Kling is the Chief Meteorologist and 5PM Anchor at WKYC in Cleveland. WKYC's multi-Emmy award winning Chief Meteorologist and Emmy Award winning anchor, Betsy Kling, was born and raised right here in Northeast Ohio. Her hometown, Copley, is in Summit County. After graduating from Copley High School, she went to Bowling Green State University where she earned her journalism degree and a minor in meteorology. She finished her remaining meteorology coursework through Mississippi State University. Betsy worked in Fort Wayne, Indiana, and Jacksonville, Florida, before coming home in 2003. In 2008 she became Cleveland's first female Chief Meteorologist.

Betsy is part of a small (but growing!) group of women in the country who have earned the prestigious Certified Broadcast Meteorologist (CBM) accreditation from the American Meteorological Society, as well as the Seal of Approval from the National Weather Association (NWA).

In 2018, WKYC tapped Betsy to start a multi-year initiative to encourage and promote girls and women in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math). Calling it "Growing Curiosity: Girls In STEM," the station quickly gained recognition for shining the spotlight on women in STEM careers and highlighting "STEMbassadors" -- women and girls doing great things in STEM. Jessica chairs the Cleveland Heights Planning Commission and represents Verizon on the Government Affairs Committee of the Greater Akron Chamber of Commerce, the Public Policy and Advocacy Committee of Cleveland Neighborhood Progress, and the board of REDI Cincinnati, a JobsOhio regional affiliate. She has served in the past as the Vice Chair of the Cleveland Heights Charter Review Committee and on the United Black Fund, Hispanic Alliance, and Future Heights boards. She currently serves on the board of the Cleveland Heights Democrats and Bikur Cholim, a Jewish health support organization. Jessica was chosen as one of the 2015 Crain's Cleveland Business Forty Under 40, a 2019 Cleveland Jewish News Difference Maker, and a 2020 25 Under 35 Mover and Shaker.

Grace Gallucci is the Executive Director and CEO for the Northeast Ohio Areawide Coordinating Agency (NOACA), the metropolitan planning organization (MPO) for Greater Cleveland, responsible for transportation and environmental planning, and resource allocation in five counties in Northeast Ohio.

Ms. Gallucci has 30 years of finance and planning experience in transportation. Before joining NOACA, she held posts at the Chicago Regional Transportation Authority; Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority; and the Office of Transportation, Broward County, Florida.

Ms. Gallucci has been an adjunct professor at Cleveland State University, Kent State University, University of Illinois at Chicago, and Northwestern University, teaching courses in public finance, economics, public policy, and transportation management. She holds a Master of Science in Urban Studies from Cleveland State University (CSU), and a Master of Public Administration and a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration from the University of Dayton.

Ms. Gallucci has been the chair of the Northeast Ohio Sustainability Communities Consortium since 2013, which received the Daniel Burnham Award for best comprehensive plan from the American Planning Association, its highest honor. Under her leadership at NOACA, the agency received the national award as best MPO in 2021 for Outstanding Overall Achievement from the Association of Metropolitan Planning Organizations.

She is active in various professional organizations: Ohio Association of Regional Councils, research panels for the Transportation Research Board of the National Academies of Science, and the U.S. Department of Transportation's Transportation Review Advisory Committee for Safety. She has mentored dozens of women during her career.

Born in Northeastern Pennsylvania, she earned a B.A. in psychology and an MBA from Pennsylvania State University. Ms. Juris moved to Ohio in 1999 to join University Hospitals. As a board-certified Art Therapist, Shannon has devoted her life to the mental health of young people, with a decade of advocacy for LGBT+ youth, including writing her recently published book on Art Therapy with gender diverse children and adolescents.

Professionally, Scott-Miller held titles as Director of Complementary Therapies at the University of Michigan; Executive Director of the Art Therapy Studio in Cleveland; Adjunct Professor at Ursuline College and John Carroll University; and is currently the Community Engagement Manager for nonprofit Colors+ in Fairview Park.

Locally, she serves as a Patient Family Advisor for The MetroHealth System, to help build affirming healthcare programs for transgender youth. As an active member of this committee, she provides expertise on the patient experience and assists in problem solving areas. She also provides staff education within MetroHealth and presents locally and nationally with the MetroHealth team. She has served on her Lakewood PTS boards for several years, collaborating with the Board of Education to update its harassment and youth protection policies. Shannon also co-founded the Parents of Lakewood LGBT Youth organization, which advocates for education, mental health services, and public safety.

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
