

Tips on How to Prepare for Your Gold Award Interview

Initial Interview:

- Review your Project Proposal before your interview.
- Wear your Girl Scout uniform.
- The first thing you will be asked to do is to tell the committee about your project from start to finish. Be clear and thorough the more detail and information you can share with the committee the better!
 - Highlight the 5 Key Elements of the Gold Award within your project: root cause, national/global link, leadership, sustainability, measurability.
- Use PowerPoint, note cards, and/or other visual aids while presenting.
- Have something to take notes on.
- Be open and receptive to constructive feedback from the committee.

Final Interview:

- Touch base with your Gold Award Mentor before your Final Interview to review your project together.
- Review your Final Report before your interview.
- Wear your Girl Scout uniform.
- Be prepared to reflect on how your project went from start to finish, challenges you faced, and what you learned about yourself during the Gold Award process.
- Use PowerPoint, note cards, and/or other visual aids while presenting (the committee loves to see pictures of your project!)

Reminders:

- Parents/caregivers are NOT permitted to interview with/for you.
- Interviews do not count towards your Gold Award project's 80 hours.
- Gold Award interviews are conducted by the Gold Award Committee, a group of GSNEO volunteers.
- Being nervous before/during your interview is a valid feeling! Be assured that the Gold Award Committee is friendly, helpful, and wants to see you succeed!
