IMPORTANT INFORMATION

WHAT TO WEAR	Students must wear closed toed shoes to be able to participate in all activities. They should dress comfortably, long hair should be tied back.
WHAT TO BRING	Students do not need to bring anything with them for this experience.
FOOD + DRINK	Students should bring a packed lunch that does not need to be refrigerated if staying for lunch. They are also welcomed to bring a water bottle or drink. We have water cups and a drinking fountain available.
PHOTOS	Students need to have a photo released form signed by a parent or guardian. These forms will be collected upon arrival to the center. If students do not have the permission slip signed, the teacher will be responsible for ensuring the student wears a paper bracelet.
HEALTH AND SAFETY	Educators are responsible for communicating any health or safety concerns including allergies, physical accommodations, or other needs of the group. Basic first aid supplies and an AED are available at the STEM Center.
CHAPERONE PARTICIPATION	Teachers and chaperones should be prepared to be an active participant throughout the day. All learning activities are hands-on and many students will require guidance and assistance. Chaperones are also responsible for monitoring lunch time.
