- **Follow the Rules:** Comply with GSUSA Policies, Standards and Guidelines, Volunteer Essentials, Safety Activity Checkpoints, GSNEO Bylaws, and GSNEO Volunteer Policies.
- **Membership:** Become a member of the Girl Scouts of the USA (\$45).
- **Communication:** Volunteers in this role need to be able to send and receive messages through email or phone.
- **Term:** One (1) year. The term commences at the close of the annual meeting.
- **Meetings and Time Commitment:**
 - **New Board Member Orientation:** 1 hour time commitment
 - **Regular Board Meetings:** The Board of Directors meets formally at least four (4) times per year. The meetings are generally held virtually at the GSNEO Macedonia Service Center
 - **Annual Meeting:** Held in the spring
