Commercial Certification is now in a BLENDED form. You are required to do an online session before attending the class in the commercial kitchen. The training is Camp specific. In this class you will be learn everything you need to know. This includes who's permitted in the kitchen, food safety, dishwasher, griddle, stoves and convection oven operation, and much more. This class is for Camp Ledgewood's Commercial Kitchen only.	FREE
Blended First Aid/CPR/AED	This course satisfies the requirements for becoming a certified first-aider. This Blended Learning class includes an online part and in person part to complete your certification. Dress for floor activities and make sure you bring proof of completion of the online classes to your in-person skills class. If the course is over the lunch hour, please bring a sack lunch and a beverage. NOTE: ON-TIME ARRIVAL IS VERY IMPORTANT. NOTE THE FOLLOWING IS American Red Cross language when describing this class: The 2021 Adult and Pediatric First Aid/CPR/AED blended learning course equips students to recognize and care for a variety of first aid, breathing, and cardiac emergencies involving adults, children, and infants. It is designed for students who need a certification that satisfies OSHA, workplace, or other regulatory requirements. This class is taught in a blended learning format and the online portion (accessed via mobile, desktop or tablet) must be completed prior to attending the instructor-led skills session. Upon successful completion, a valid 2-year digital certificate for Adult and Pediatric First Aid/CPR/AED is issued.
